

## Biogenic amines in rainbow trout, tilapia, and cachama fish, available for consumption in Nariño, southern Colombia

**Table S3.:** Description of selected fish outlets in the city of Pasto, Nariño-Colombia. Fish outlets: The description corresponds to fish-selling the conditions observed in each establishment.

Fish outlet	Description
1	The stall was covered with sanitary materials, waterproof, easy to clean and in good condition; the seller handled the fish without gloves, mask or apron; the samples were frozen and had no labeling.
2	The stall was covered with sanitary materials, waterproof, easy to clean and in good condition; they make use of refrigeration chambers; the seller did not wear appropriate clothing for food handling and received the purchase money without washing his hands. The fish were not labeled or packed, the skin of the samples was not wet; the eyes of the fish were not transparent, bright or outgoing, the iris was stained red; and the odor of the fish was not fresh.
3	The stall sold fish with other foods items (chicken, red meat). The food items were not labelled and were exhibited in deteriorated aluminum trays and exposed to the environment. The fish was soft and semi-frozen, had an ammonia-like odor, and their skin was dull.
